Literary works, especially poetry, are metaphorical and figurative. They inspire people differently with each reading. Therefore, there is always a need for new and different interpretations. This deepens the literary work and creates cultural richness. In this work, the result of my reading literary works—especially novels—I have included many notable figures and their works: Hannibal, Napoleon, Fouché, Dostoyevsky, Tolstoy, Said Nursi, Jesus Christ, Shakespeare, Sezai Karakoç, Nuri Pakdil, and Cahit Zarifoğlu. 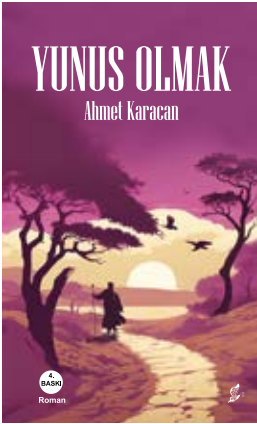

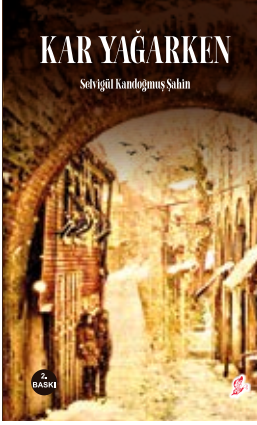

In this contemporary novel, Selviğül K. Şahin uses the backdrop of the turmoil of the 1990s, the Iraq War, and the Bosnian Genocide to tell the story of university students undergoing a revolutionary transformation within their souls. Through the dominant perspective and the characters' stream-of-consciousness dialogues, she conveys the young people's dignified stances, their quests, their pains, and their struggles to form identities contrary to those of their families and themselves, utilizing the possibilities of modern and postmodern novels. The novel has a strong, solid plot grounded in reality.

Enriched with intertextuality and introductory epigraphs, the novel is written in a fluid, refined language in which genres within genres are encountered. Sometimes we read an anonymous love letter; sometimes, a letter written by a daughter at odds with her father—like Kafka—but never sent.

Since the characters are university students who read widely and focus on their search, the novel provides readers with a magnificent bibliography and reading map woven into the text. It contains references to the works of many local and foreign poets and writers.

While the Snow Falls is a guidebook of a novel, accompanied by the profound and meaningful quest for truth and self-discovery.

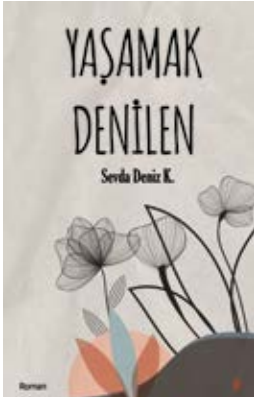

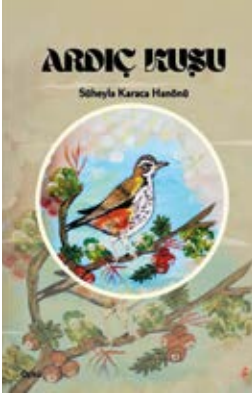
## **Nuri Pakdil A Bazooka of Flowers**

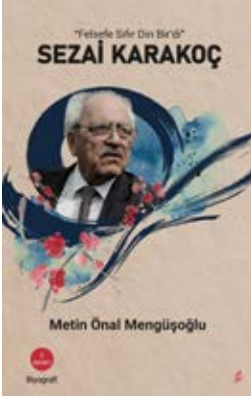
## Deer's Eye

Today, the mass media virtually force individuals to choose between popular culture and traditional values through the content they produce. Through talk shows, reality shows, TV series, celebrity parades, news, and live broadcasts, the media has duped its viewers into believing that it can capture reality by showing images from every moment of human life. However, in the post-truth era, traditional and new media have often created new misconceptions or, by not showing reality, led people to further reinforce their own beliefs and ideologies. In the words of Nilüfer Göle, "Turkey has fallen under a media spell where truth has been mixed with patriotic sentiments, gossip, insults and commercialization."

The "lust for fame" offered by the media has created an addiction in its followers. Many people have fallen into a psychological void as the fast fading and quickly consumed signs of fame faded. There is a growing numbness, a lack of interest in oneself or one's surroundings. Instead of being sufficiently informed to understand the causes of our own problems and issues, today we have been thrust into a strange but real self-consciousness of dependence on cheap entertainment and magazines.

In this book, Ekmel Geçer evaluates the individual's relationship with mass media in the context of *media psychology* and *cultural psychology*. On the one hand, he addresses the values and attitudes that the audience acquires from the mass media, and on the other hand, he gives advice on how to control media messages.

If one link is weak, however, it does not matter how strong the others are. In other words, a chain is only as strong as its weakest link. From this perspective, one must avoid damaging the foundation of historical events. These events occur naturally due to political, administrative, military, economic, social, and religious reasons. In other words, the people who make history behave in certain ways within the framework of conditions appropriate to the circumstances. The fundamental factor in these behaviors is the fulfillment of the requirements of being human. Therefore, historical events take shape as a result of people's activities. In this context, historians should evaluate historical events with respect for the people who made history, remaining faithful to them while avoiding emotions and thoughts that cast a shadow on objectivity. An overly subjective approach to historical events can cause one to overlook the lessons and morals that can be learned from them. However, one of the main purposes of the study of history is to ensure that lessons are learned. For this reason, historians should approach individuals and events with an unbiased perspective, presenting the facts without considering the condemner's perspective. Individuals' positions and titles should not overshadow historical events. In other words, historical events should be evaluated independently of titles and positions. Written in a scientific and academic style, this work attempts to present the events of the Rashidun Caliphate period objectively and critically, in line with the nature of history.
